## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- An Associate in Arts or Associate in Science Degree is awarded to those who complete a minimum of sixty (60) units in Associate Degree level courses, including one of the three general eduction pattern with at least a 2.0 grade point average.
- A minimum of twelve (12) units must be earned in residence at this institution.
- At least 18 units must be completed in a major and all courses in the major must be completed with a grade of $A, B, C$, or $P$.


## CATALOG RIGHTS

Students graduating within five (5) academic years of initial enrollment shall have the option of completing either:
A. the degree requirements of the College catalog in effect at the time of initial enrollment

OR
B. any set of revised degree requirements published in a subsequent Porterville College catalog.

Students graduating more than five (5) academic years after initial enrollment must adhere to the specific degree requirements in any Porterville College catalog within the five-year period prior to the student's graduation. To maintain catalog rights, the student must maintain continuous enrollment during the five (5) year period. Continuous enrollment means a student must earn a grade of "A", "B", "C", "D", "F", "NP", "P", "I", "IP", "RD", "W", "EW" and "MW" in at least one course each academic year. For the purpose of continuous enrollment, an academic year begins with the summer semester and includes the following fall and spring terms petitions for exceptions should be directed to the Vice President of Academic Services. Catalog rights apply only to Porterville College graduation and program requirements. If other institutions change their requirements for entrance, graduation, satisfaction of general education patterns, or change their requirements in other ways, it may be necessary for the student to meet with the new requirements upon transfer, even if continuous enrollment has been maintained. Prerequisites override catalog rights.

Degree requirements include the following: courses in your major, one of the three general education patterns (PC AA/AS, CSU GE
BREADTH, or IGETC), and the additional campus graduation requirements listed below. Combining these areas and, if necessary, elective courses must equal 60 total credits with a minimum total grade point average of 2.0 in order to graduate.

- Major Requirements

The courses required for your major are listed in the college catalog. The catalog can be accessed via the college website.

- General Education Patterns

There are three general education patterns you may select from in order to complete your requirements. Your specific
academic goal will determine which one of these checklists to follow. The table below will help you decide which checklist is more appropriate for you:

## - Additional Campus Graduation Requirements

In addition to the major and general education requirements indicated above, you must also complete the following campus graduation requirements: 1 course in Education, 1 course in Multicultural Studies and HLED P112 OR 3 units in Kinesiology (PC General Education Area A, J and K, Area F in CSU Breadth Pattern, Last section in IGETC) Not required to be taken as part of the AA-T / AS-T degrees

## - Associate Degrees for Transfer (AA-T / AS-T)

The Student Transfer Achievement Reform Act (Senate Bill 1440), now codified in California Education Code sections (66746-66749) guarantees admission to a California State University (CSU) campus for any community college student who completes an "associate degree for transfer," a newly established variation of the associate degrees traditionally offered at a California community colleges. The Associate in Arts for Transfer (AA-T) or the Associate in Science for Transfer (AS-T) is intended for students who plan to complete a bachelor's degree in a similar major at a CSU campus. Students completing these degrees (AA-T or $A S-T$ ) are guaranteed admission to the CSU system, but not to a particular campus or major. Please consult the Transfer Information and Requirements section of the General Catalog for details.

## - Dual Degrees/Majors

To be eligible for multiple Associate degrees a student must complete all graduation requirements for each degree.
Note: This is not an official document and should be used as reference only. Please visit assist.org for official information on articulation agreements for general education and/or course to course articulation.

It is highly recommended that students meet with a PC counselor and complete a Student Educational Plan (SEP).
