# GOT CRIMINAL ADMINISTRATIVE FEES?

---

UNDER A NEW CALIFORNIA LAW (AB 1869), COUNTIES AND COURTS CANNOT CHARGE OR COLLECT CERTAIN CRIMINAL ADMINISTRATIVE FEES STARTING ON JULY 1, 2021.

---

### WHAT FEES ARE ELIMINATED?

#### Arrest:

- Arrest
- Booking
- Citation/release on own recognizance

#### Representation by a Lawyer:

- Registration for court-appointed lawyer
- Cost of your court-appointed lawyer (e.g., public defender)

#### Probation/Supervision:

- Probation or parole supervision
- Pre-sentence/investigation report
- Jurisdictional transfer
- Home detention
- Electronic monitoring
- Interstate compact supervision
- Payment/installment plan

#### Pre-Trial:

- Work furlough program
- Home detention program
- Voluntary work release (Sheriff's Work Alternative) program
- Electronic monitoring instead of bail or jail

### What should I do now?

Contact your attorney or a local legal service provider near you (see next page) to see how this law will specifically affect you.

Check to see if your county has stopped charging and collecting fees early. If your county has not yet taken action, you can ask your board of supervisors to implement the new law now.

### What if I owe unpaid fees?

You do not need to take any action. Any unpaid fees, associated civil judgments, liens, or interest you owe will be automatically written-off on July 1, 2021.

Some fees can still be charged and collected after the law goes into effect. Check with your attorney or local legal service provider to find out if there are any fees that you may still have to pay.

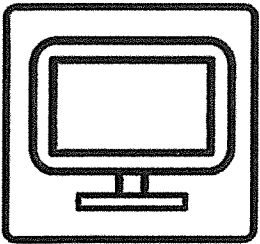
# CAN'T AFFORD TO PAY FOR YOUR TRAFFIC TICKET?

The online ability-to-pay tool may be able to help you.

If you want to resolve your ticket, you can request a reduction or other solutions online.



How does the ability-to-pay tool work?

You can quickly, easily, and privately log on to the online system, explain your financial situation to the court, and request an ability-to-pay determination for your ticket.

Handle your case—without coming to court.\*
